

Anti-ragging

Ragging is a serious crime and is punishable by law. Ragging is prohibited as per the decision of the Supreme Court.

- Ragging in any form is totally prohibited.
- Anyone indulging in ragging will face immediate expulsion and will also be debarred from pursuing course from any other institution.

Ragging is totally prohibited and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting it, whether actively or passively, or being a part of conspiracy to promote Ragging, is liable to be punished strictly in accordance to the rules laid down by the Institution, University Grants Commission and in accordance to the provisions of the Prohibition of Ragging Act as per supreme court order. Such action would include but is not limited to debarment or expulsion of such student and action as per the law.

Broadly speaking, Ragging is any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.
